MACARTHUR BICENTENARY 1806 - 2006

On January 15, 1806, pioneer farmer, John Macarthur officially received the 5000 acres of land granted to him by Lord Camden. He named the estate Camden Park. The Macarthur's established the merino wool empire, wheat growing, dairying and horticulture in our area and planted Australia's first commercial vineyard.
